CALL FOR SEED FUNDING APPLICATIONS

Applications due by 5 April 2024 by 12:00pm AWST

The Wesfarmers Centre of Vaccines & Infectious Diseases (WCVID) at the Telethon Kids Institute, aims to reduce the burden of important childhood infectious diseases by finding better prevention and treatment solutions; bringing health solutions to Aboriginal children is a major focus area.

The Wesfarmers Centre have identified three objectives and vision for the next 5 years, beginning 2022. These are:


- 1) Childhood Infections: reducing the burden of childhood infections
 - Reduce vaccine preventable diseases, preventing hospitalisation and morbidity
 - Develop, trial, and evaluate infection prevention and treatment strategies
 - Enhance sepsis recognition and treatment to improve childhood outcomes
- 2) Aboriginal Health: ensuring equity and reducing health disadvantage
 - Prevent ear, skin, and lung disease, improving short and long-term outcomes
 - Prevent rheumatic heart disease, saving lives and closing the gap
 - Ensure all research occurs in partnership with community and is guided by a strong Aboriginal voice
- 3) Global Public Health: promoting health through research and partnerships
 - Develop novel approaches to reduce emerging threats including antimicrobial resistance and vaccine hesitancy
 - Prevent the health harms of COVID-19 and emerging pathogens

WCVID supports high quality research by providing support for researchers to undertake activities of high priority to the WCVID and in doing so, enable them to develop good ideas and grow those ideas into fundable competitive grants.

The WCVID Seed Funding aims to encourage new research activities, and develop new research projects and new partnerships, particularly scientist-clinician partnerships. The amount available per project funded is capped at \$25,000. All applicants need to justify their requested budget, broken down against well-defined deliverables and defined project costs. If a proposal is successful, the investigators may receive the grant in two or more instalments according to demonstrated achievement of scheduled deliverables. The planned duration of funded activities will be no more than 12 months.

ADVICE

- Activities must be aimed at developing research ideas which target important childhood infectious diseases.
- Applicants are to keep in mind that the purpose is to fund seed activities that will support a major competitive grant application, and not to support a complete project.
- Seed Funding can be used toward activities including—but not limited to—generating pilot data, developing collaborations with other labs and institutes (including travel), conducting community/stakeholder consultations, protocol development, simulations to support study design, development of a competitive project grant submission, etc.
- Previous recipients can apply for further Seed Funding to build on earlier activities if they demonstrate earlier deliverables have been met.
- Project teams must include at least one member who is a student, employee, or WA-based honorary researcher of the Telethon Kids Institute.
- Awarded amounts cannot be used to cover general infrastructure costs.
- Budgets should be submitted using the current Budget Template for Research Funding Applications which

APPLICATION REVIEW PROCESS AND EVALUATION CRITERIA

- An internal Grant Review Panel will review and judge the eligible applications.
- Applications will be assessed on 1) scientific quality, 2) significance and/or innovation, 3) team
 quality, capability, contribution, & capacity building, and 4) engagement with community, research
 peers, & stakeholders in developing the proposal.
- The highest ranked applications will be awarded up to \$25,000.

WHAT'S REQUIRED AFTER YOU RECEIVE FUNDING?

- Funding will be contingent upon successful applicants presenting their proposal to the 'community' through a Community Reference/Advisory Group and/or Aboriginal Research Projects Forum as appropriate.
- The WCVID must be acknowledged in all publications or presentations related to the supported project.
 This includes in the by-line of any publications arising from project (as affiliation of the Telethon Kids Institute's employee or honorary).
- Successful applicants are expected to present their proposal at the Infectious Diseases Research
 Seminar series, and outcomes of activities at the Wesfarmers Centre Retreat.
